**All members with email addresses will be sent an email via the INFOLIST with a link to the current edition of the Newsletter. Members with no email address will be sent a hard copy of the newsletter.** Since printing and postage costs are increasing, we ask for your help in controlling our budget by reading the Newsletter on-line.

But the most current way to find out what's happening is from our private email INFOLIST. You can expect to receive information on your computer about New Frontiers' members and New Frontiers' activities and events. And you will get it first! Could be weekly, or even sometimes on a daily basis. To ensure your privacy, personal contact information about you, or any of our members, will NOT be included in any of the INFOLIST email messages.
